Letter from the Commissioner

When the 86th regular session of the Texas legislature adjourns in May 2019, Texas will be nearly one-third of the way toward the conclusion of its 15-year higher education strategic plan, *60x30TX*. That means the legislature will have put in place a state budget and policies that will largely determine the likelihood of the state reaching its *60x30* goals in higher educational attainment and completion, providing all college (both two- and four-year) graduates marketable skills, and keeping student debt at manageable levels. In preparation for the 86th session, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board will make both budgetary and policy recommendations to the legislature intended to accelerate the state's progress toward achieving these goals. But whatever the outcomes of the 86th session, Texas must stand firm in its commitment to achieving the goals of *60x30TX*.

The 2018 higher education almanac shows where we stand today. As I have been saying for several years, our progress toward achieving the goals of *60x30TX* can be summed up in two sentences: (1) We're getting better but not fast enough. (2) We can't get there doing business as usual. Nevertheless, Texas has some real accomplishments to build on. Our statewide university six-year graduation rate has gone up from 49 percent in 2000 to 61 percent in 2017. With the implementation of outcomes-based funding, both completion and transfer rates in our two-year colleges have moved up recently. We now have six colleges and universities that have adopted the Texas Affordable Baccalaureate program, which entails implementing innovative practices such as competency-based education and can reduce the cost of baccalaureate degrees by more than half.

Whatever the 86th legislature does, Texas public colleges and universities must find ways to get better educational outcomes with their resources. Developmental education remains a challenge, but the New Mathways Project and integrated reading and writing are showing promising results. Odessa College has achieved dramatic improvement in student persistence and completion by offering students eight-week academic terms, which provide working students more flexibility than standard 15-week semesters. Intensive student data analysis and intrusive advising are showing positive results, and institutions are finding that their investments in such practices are generally recovered because of higher levels of state funding generated by increased student persistence and completion.

As we push closer to 2030, our Texas colleges and universities must address two central myths in higher education that invariably undermine student success. The first is that, in the three-month period between graduating high school and landing on a college campus, students are magically transformed into adults. Consequently, we often make essential services such as academic and financial advising, tutoring, and psychological services optional, with predictable results. Recent studies show that mandatory or "intrusive" services typically yield better outcomes.

The second myth in higher education that seriously inhibits student and institutional success is that, by virtue of earning a doctoral degree, faculty know how to teach. Alas, not so. Many college faculty, both young and experienced, did not teach in graduate school and, even if they did, typically received little guidance from their professors and fellow graduate students. Often, they know little about cognitive science or about how students learn and retain information. Institutions in Texas and other states have experienced significant improvement in student retention and success by introducing some form of professional development in teaching for faculty.

Finally, in Texas public higher education, we must address, if not a myth, the widespread belief that all improvement in student success is expensive and cannot be accomplished without greater state support. We simply can't use this as an excuse for not getting better results. Taking roll in class, learning students' names, and requiring at-risk students to visit their professors are proven strategies for getting better student outcomes and do not necessarily cost more than current practices. The University of South Florida significantly improved student success rates simply by encouraging faculty to hold office hours immediately after class.

Although the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board will recommend higher levels of funding in the 86th legislative session for our public colleges and universities, no one can predict the result. Whatever happens, I urge my colleagues in higher education to focus on best practices and innovation and move Texas resolutely toward achieving the goals of *60x30TX*.

Definitions, Data Years, and Data Sources

The following definitions, data years, and data sources will help you navigate the data provided in this year's almanac. They are particularly helpful in reading the institutional profiles. For a more comprehensive list of data source references, see p. 90.

Accountability (Peer) groups: Texas public universities are grouped based on key indicators such as mission, number of doctoralresearch/scholarship programs, and research expenditures. Public two-year colleges are grouped based on size and/or type.

Average tuition and fees: The cost of tuition and mandatory fees charged to a student taking 30 semester credit hours (SCH) (15 SCH in the fall and 15 SCH in the spring). For four-year public institutions and the Lamar and Technical Colleges, tuition includes mandatory tuition (state-required tuition) and designated tuition (set by institutional governing boards). Submitted to the THECB on the College Student Budget Report. **FY 2018 rates**

Bachelor's graduates as a percentage of undergraduate FTSE enrollment: The number of students who received an undergraduate degree from a university in a given year divided by the annual full-time student equivalent (FTSE) enrollment. The FTSE enrollment is the total of all semester credit hours divided by 30 (the number of semester credit hours considered full time for undergraduates annually). Dual credit enrollments are not included in FTSE. FY 2017

Debt:

Average student debt: For FY 2017 graduates, average student loan debt includes all identifiable debt prior to graduation for those students with debt. University graduates include those who received a bachelor's degree. Two-year institution graduates include those who received an associate degree or certificate.

- Native student debt: Average debt for students who graduated from the institution where they were enrolled as a first time in college (FTIC) student.
- Portion as parent debt: Portion of native students' debt that was incurred by a parent through a federal PLUS loan (2005–11) or a federal Direct PLUS loan (2009–current). All native students with debt are included in parent debt calculation.
- Transfer student debt: Average debt for students who graduated from an institution but were not first time in college (FTIC) at that institution.

Debt profile for 2010 cohort: For completers and non-completers, the average student loan debt includes identifiable debt up to graduation or through FY 2017. Students who were still enrolled (had not graduated by FY 2017) were included as non-completers.

Identifiable debt: All undergraduate debt accumulated at Texas institutions as reported to the THECB, including federal and state loans, parent PLUS loans, and some private educational loans. **Percentage with debt:** Percentage of an institution's graduates who incurred identifiable debt prior to graduation. **FY 2017**

Statewide student debt as a percentage of first-year wage: Median of individual student's identifiable debt to first-year wage percentage for students awarded a level I or II certificate, associate degree, or bachelor's degree from a Texas public institution. Individual must have student loan debt data at time of award and wages in first year following award. Bachelor's degrees awarded at community colleges are not included. Debt data for 2015 graduates. Wage data from 2016. (Source: Financial Aid Database System, Office of Personnel Management, unemployment insurance [UI] wage records)

Degrees awarded/degrees and certificates

awarded: For universities, the number of degrees awarded; certificates are not included. For two-year institutions, the number of degrees and certificates awarded by race/ ethnicity. **FY 2017**

Developmental education:

College-level course completion: Percentage of total students below state readiness standards (called Texas Success Initiative [TSI]) in math, reading, and/or writing who successfully completed a college-level course in the related area, as applicable, with a grade of A, B, or C within two years of college enrollment. *Fall* **2014 cohort**

Total students below state standard: Students in college for the first time (both full and part time) who did not meet the state readiness standards in math, reading, and/or writing at the time of enrollment. *Fall 2014 cohort*

State readiness standard met: Percentage of total students below state readiness standards in math, reading, and/or writing who satisfied state standards within two years of college enrollment. *Fall 2014 cohort*

Dual credit:

Dual credit students: High school students who attempt one or more college courses for high school and college credit.

Dual credit as percentage of total enrollment: Dual credit enrollment as a percentage of the total enrollment. *Fall 2017*

Dual credit outcomes: College persistence and graduation rates for an institution's dual credit students who subsequently enrolled in the same or a different Texas college or university. The percentage who earned a baccalaureate and/or associate degree is unduplicated. *Fall* **2012 first time in college (FTIC) cohort**

Earnings of graduates: Annual wages of graduates during the first, third, fifth, eighth, and tenth year after graduation. Wage

calculations include students who worked in Texas at least three-quarters of the year and did not earn a higher degree during the tracking period. No inflation factor was applied. For 2006 graduates, the wages are for 2007 (first year), 2009 (third year), 2011 (fifth year), 2012 (eighth year), and 2016 (tenth year). For 2015 graduates, the first-year wages were calculated for 2016.

Enrollment:

Fall headcount: The institutional fall headcount enrollment, including all full- and part-time students. Undergraduate headcount does not include postbaccalaureate students. *Fall 2017*

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) undergraduate enrollment: The sum of all fall undergraduate semester credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15. *Fall 2017*

Full-time student equivalent (FTSE) total enrollment: The sum of all fall semester

credit hours (SCH) attempted divided by 15 for undergraduate SCH, 12 for master's and doctoral professional practice SCH, 9 for doctoral research/scholarship SCH, and 17 for optometry SCH. *Fall 2017*

Faculty:

Total university faculty: All faculty members with teaching responsibilities, excluding teaching assistants. *Fall 2016*

University tenured/tenure track faculty: All faculty members with teaching responsibilities who have received, or are on a track to receive, tenure. *Fall 2016*

Two-year college faculty: Total number of faculty members and percentage of full-time (teaching 80% or more) faculty members. This includes faculty teaching flex courses. *Fall 2016*

First-time students accepted: Percentage of first-time summer/fall applicants accepted by the institution. *Fall 2017*

First-time undergraduates in Texas top 10%: The percentage of first-time undergraduates entering in the summer or fall class who ranked in the top 10% of their Texas public high school graduating class. **Fall 2017**

Graduates' status/success:

Baccalaureate graduates' employment/ enrollment status: The percentage of graduates employed in the fourth quarter of the calendar year after graduation and/or enrolled in a Texas institution in the following fall after graduation. FY 2016

Two-year college graduates' employment/ enrollment status: The percentage of academic or technical graduates employed in the fourth quarter of the calendar year after graduation and/or enrolled in a Texas two- or four-year institution in the following fall after graduation, as specified. **FY 2016**

PROFILES: 4-YEAR

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Graduation rates:

Public university 4-, 6-, and 10-year rates: The percentage of first-time entering, degree-seeking students who graduated with a bachelor's degree or higher from the same institution or another Texas public or independent institution after 4, 6, and 10 academic years for two groups: those students who enrolled in their first fall as full-time students (taking 12 or more semester credit hours [SCH]) and those who enrolled part-time (taking fewer than 12 SCH). *Rates through FY* 2017 (for fall 2013, 2011, and 2007 cohorts, respectively)

Public two-year college 3-, 4-, and 6-year rates: The percentage of first-time, credentialseeking undergraduates who graduate within 3, 4, or 6 academic years for two groups: those students who enrolled in their first fall as full-time students (taking 12 or more semester credit hours [SCH]) and those who enrolled part-time (taking fewer than 12 SCH). Both degrees and certificates are included. **Rates** through FY 2017 (for fall 2014, 2013, and 2011 cohorts, respectively)

Developmental education/non-developmental education rates: The percentage of first-time, full-time, credential-seeking undergraduates who graduated after three academic years by whether they met or did not meet state readiness standards in one or more areas under the Texas Success Initiative (TSI).

Percentage of graduates completing 30 SCH at a two-year college: The percentage of university graduates who took 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) at two-year public institutions. FY 2017

Students receiving Pell:

Percentage of students receiving Pell Grants/ received Pell in current year: The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled in the fall semester who received a Pell Grant for the current academic year. *Fall 2016*

Ever received Pell in higher education: The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled in the fall semester who received a Pell Grant at any time since 1997. *Fall 2016*

Ever received Pell and within two years of graduation: The percentage of undergraduate students enrolled in the fall semester with a classification of junior or senior at a four-year institution or sophomore or above at a twoyear institution who received a Pell Grant at any time since 1997. *Fall 2016* (*Source for Pell Grant data: Financial Aid Database System*)

(HBCU), lower-division, percentile, SAT/ACT test scores, UG, and upper-division.

Race/ethnicity: In addition to African American, Hispanic, and White, the following race/ethnicity categories are included.

International student: A person who is not a citizen or permanent resident of the United States and who is in this country on a temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. It may also refer to a nonresident alien.

Other: All other races not individually listed, including Native Hawaiian, other Pacific Islander, American Indian, Native Alaskan, Asian, multiracial not including African American, or unknown origin.

Research expenditures: Expenditures from federal, state, private, and institutional sources combined, as reported in the annual research expenditures report. **FY 2017**

Restricted research expenditures: Expenditures contracted, gifted, or granted by an external entity (such as a government agency, a philanthropic organization, or an individual) where the primary use must be research or development. The Coordinating Board collects restricted research expenditures for formula distribution of Research Development Funds (RDF) and as a criterion for the National Research Universities Fund (NRUF). However, restricted research expenditures are more narrowly defined here than in the Annual Financial Reports (AFR) and thus not comparable. Estimates for restricted research expenditures for institutions not participating in RDF or NRUF are research expenditures minus state-appropriated funds, institutional funds, and indirect cost. FY 2017

Federal and private research expenditures per

T/TT faculty FTE: Total of federal and private research expenditures per tenured/tenure-track (T/TT) full-time faculty member equivalent (includes only faculty members with teaching responsibility). FY 2017 (research expenditures), Fall 2016 (T/TT faculty FTE)

Revenue per FTSE: Revenue, excluding auxiliary and public service funds, divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE) by categories, including total revenue, tuition and fees, state appropriation, federal funds, and institutional funds. Tuition and fees is the net of scholarship discounts and allowances. **FY 2017** **Student/faculty ratio:** Full-time student equivalents (FTSE) divided by full-time equivalent (FTE) teaching faculty. For FTE teaching faculty, faculty reported on CBM008 must match CBM004 to be included in calculation. *Fall 2016*

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Time and SCH to degree: The average length of time in years and number of attempted semester credit hours (SCH) to complete an associate degree (for two-year institutions) or a bachelor's degree (for four-year institutions) for students who graduated in FY 2017. Students are tracked 10 years back for accumulation of semester credit hours and total years and months that have elapsed from the first date of entry. Dual credit and developmental education hours are excluded. (*Note: Dual credit hours were included in these measures prior to the* 2014 almanac.)

Transfers to a senior institution:

Cohort: Number of students entering higher education for the first time at a two-year public institution who were not concurrently enrolled at a four-year institution. *Fall 2011 cohort*

Transfer rate: The percentage of students in the cohort who transferred to a senior institution within six years. *Fall 2011 cohort through FY 2017*

Two-year college students at universities:

Baccalaureate graduates who completed SCHs at two-year public colleges: Percentage of baccalaureate graduates who completed 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) at two-year public colleges. FY 2017

Graduation of two-year college students: Percentage of undergraduates who were firsttime transfer students from Texas two-year public colleges with 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) in the six years prior to transferring and who graduated from the same Texas public university within four years. **FY 2017**

Uses of funds per state-funded FTSE:


Operating expenses divided by the number of full-time student equivalents (FTSE). Operating expenses are broken out by total; instruction, research, and academic support; student services and scholarships; institutional support and operations and maintenance (OM) of plant; and other expenses (e.g., capital outlays from current fund sources). **FY 2017**

Except as noted in the almanac, the sources of data are the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board institutionally certified CBM data; most measures are available in



60X30TX Strategic Plan Update

Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 60x30TX, the state's strategic plan for higher education, is focused on student success and establishing a globally competitive Texas workforce by 2030. Achieving the goals of 60x30TX rests heavily on

collaboration among stakeholders in higher education, K–12 education, and the workforce. The plan addresses students' desires for a better life, employers' desires to remain competitive, and the state's need for a robust economy. Students of all backgrounds must complete certificates or degrees in larger numbers if the future workforce of Texas is to be globally competitive in 2030. Meeting that goal means increasing student success, addressing college affordability, and making explicit the workplace skills that students obtain in their programs.

60x30TX has four student-centered goals in the areas related to levels of postsecondary education in the population, completion, marketable skills, and student debt. The new plan calls for ambitious, yet realistic, interim targets and strategies that will get Texas to its final goals in 2030.

In 2017, the THECB continued to promote 60x30TX across the state; 60x30TX.com serves as the hub for the plan. This website provides resources about 60x30TX, including data that show progress toward plan targets and goals. For example, 60x30TX.com is home to the agency's new interactive attainment map, which allows users to explore how education levels of 25- to 34-year-old Texans are distributed across the state.

Last year, the agency organized several Data Fellows workshops as well, providing education professionals from across the state hands-on training about data and resources relevant to reaching the goals and targets of 60x30TX. Plus, fellows engaged with diverse colleagues to consider the state's educational challenges and progress.

Regional target efforts were also launched in each of the 10 higher education regions in 2017 to encourage regional mobilization around the plan. The THECB developed regional data workbooks and a starter kit to inform and guide regional stakeholders as they identify strategies for reaching selected plan goals and targets in their area.

The THECB continues to provide training to assist higher education institutions in implementing and achieving the 60x30TX marketable skills goal. In 2017, the agency developed and disseminated marketable skills guidelines to higher education institutions. In April 2018, the agency hosted the second Marketable Skills Conference.


60x30: Educated Population



60x30TX is founded on the critical need for Texas to produce an educated workforce that is able to adapt and compete at the highest levels. The world's most competitive workforces have younger populations with more education compared to the United States and compared to Texas. Currently, only 42.3 percent of Texans ages 25–34 have a postsecondary degree or certificate. The best-educated societies in the world are at or near 60 percent in this age group. To compete and excel in this environment, 60x30TX sets an ambitious goal of 60 percent postsecondary attainment for young adult Texans.




Data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics make clear that students don't get much of an economic lift from college attendance unless they complete a degree or an undergraduate certificate. Texas needs to continue its record of generating impressive growth in undergraduate degree and certificate production at all colleges and universities—private, public, and for-profit. With *60x30TX*, Texas aims to award a total of 6.4 million certificates or degrees by 2030. The plan also sets targets for Hispanic, African American, male, and economically disadvantaged completers and seeks to increase the percentage of students who enroll in higher education directly after high school from the current 51.9 percent to 65 percent.






Marketable Skills




Marketable skills are those valued by employers that can be applied in a variety of work settings, including interpersonal, cognitive, and applied skills. Students acquire these skills through curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities. All programs develop skills of value in the marketplace. Students who can articulate their marketable skills are better positioned to get a suitable job. In a 2016 national study by the University of California Los Angeles Higher Education Research Institute, 85 percent of surveyed students identified "getting a better job" as the most important reason for

attending college. The 60x30TX plan requires institutions to formally identify those skills for each of its degree programs by 2030 so that students are aware of and can communicate those skills to future employers. This goal calls for every institution in Texas to articulate the identified skills to students.

GOAL By 2030, all graduates from Texas public institutions of higher education will have completed programs with identified marketable skills.

Student Debt




As a state, Texas has an opportunity to balance student loan debt and improve how higher education is financed to reduce financial barriers that students and families encounter when pursuing any level of higher education. One way to focus on student loan debt is to set the statewide goal of maintaining debt load, as measured against student earning power at graduation. *60x30TX* sets the goal to keep this ratio at 60 percent for students with debt who graduate in the state. There are several facets to this goal: (1) the role of the state, (2) the role of institutions, and (3) the role of students. While there


will be variation by sector and by student, all undergraduates with student loan debt who complete a credential from a Texas public two- and/or four-year institution are included in the 60 percent calculation. In 2017, 47 percent of undergraduate students completed their degrees and certificates with student loan debt. This goal also includes a target to maintain this percentage, so that no more than half of undergraduates complete their credentials with student loan debt.

GOAL By 2030, undergraduate student loan debt will not exceed 60 percent of first-year wage for graduates of Texas public institutions.*

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
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


Student Debt Profile

The amount of debt a student incurs can have a lasting impact on a student's life after college. Concerns about college costs and loan debt also can affect the student's decision to attend and persist in higher education. This page profiles undergraduate debt for students who attended Texas public higher education institutions. A trend line illustrating the percentage of students graduating with debt shows encouraging, although slight, decreases in recent years following several years of increases. Students who borrow but who do not complete, as highlighted in the 2010 cohort profile, have the burden of debt without the increased earnings potential of a degree. Also, as shown at the middle of the page, the average debt (for students with debt) and percentage of students with debt at Texas public universities differs considerably across institutions.







Student Loan Debt As a Percentage of First-Year Wage







Graduation Success

The most important measure of postsecondary success is degree completion. The tables below show enrollment and graduation success for first-time college students entering Texas public universities and two-year colleges in fall 2011. As the tables indicate, student enrollment in higher education does not ensure graduation. The tables also show that parttime students are less likely to complete a degree than are full-time students. In addition to the traditional graduation outcomes shown below, the bar charts at the bottom show 6- and 10-year graduation rate comparisons at universities and completion, transfer, and persistence outcomes at two-year institutions. Statewide, success numbers increase somewhat when comparing 6- and 10-year graduation rates. Both 6- and 10-year graduation rates increase over time.







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Graduation Rate of 8th Grade Cohort (2006–17)



Transfer Success

Transfer rates are becoming a more important indicator of postsecondary success since more than half of all Texas students enter higher education through a public two-year college. Students who transfer with 30 or more semester credit hours (SCH) are more likely to graduate within four years of transfer than are students who transfer with fewer than 30 SCH. Differences in transfer rates by ethnicity are also notable.






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
Developmental Education Profile

More than 40 percent of students entering a Texas public institution do not meet state college readiness standards. The majority of these students start at public community and technical colleges. Among those who are not college ready in math, reading, or writing, only 40-60 percent meet readiness standards within two years, and about 25-40 percent go on to complete a collegelevel course. With respect to completion of a degree or certificate within six years, non-ready students lag behind those who enter college ready in all subjects. Fortunately, the outcomes for underprepared students have been improving steadily over the past five years, and more progress is anticipated with the implementation of co-requisite developmental education statewide.







Entering Students Who Met College Readiness Standards







Students Who Were Not College Ready but Completed First College-Level Course within Two Years, by Subject








Students Who Were Not College Ready but Met Readiness Standards within Two Years, by Subject











General Terms

Age: Age is calculated by subtracting the individual's date of birth from the *begin date* of the reporting period. For fall, the begin date is September 1; for spring, January 1; and for summer, June 1.

At risk: Includes students who received a Pell Grant, graduated with a GED, were 20 years or older when they first entered college, started as a part-time student taking fewer than 12 hours, or had an SAT/ACT score less than the national average.

Fiscal year (FY): The state's fiscal year is similar to the academic year of institutions. The fiscal year runs from September 1 through August 31; for example, FY 2017 is September 1, 2016, to August 31, 2017.

Hispanic Serving (HS): Colleges, universities, or systems/districts in which Hispanic fall headcount enrollment constitutes a minimum of 25% of the total fall headcount enrollment.

Historically Black College or University (HBCU): Any historically black college or university established prior to 1964 whose principal mission was, and is, the education of black Americans.

Lower-division: Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with freshman and sophomore college students.

Percentile: The score below which a certain percentage of observations fall. For example, the 25th percentile score is the score below which 25% of the scores may be found, and the 75th percentile score is the score below which 75% of the scores may be found.

SAT/ACT test scores: Test score ranges are shown for Math and Evidence-Based Reading and Writing on the SAT test and for Math and English on the ACT test. Of enrolled full-time students, 50% have test scores within the ranges listed, 25% have scores above, and 25% have scores below. (*Source: USDOE IPEDS data for fall 2017, most recent data available*)

UG: Abbreviation for undergraduate.

Upper-division: Course offerings at a level of comprehension usually associated with junior and senior college students.
