## **CLINICAL EDUCATION**

Applicants, if accepted into the program, must be prepared to travel to multiple clinical facilities during their time in the program at their own expense. Assignments will be two days a week during the Fall and Spring semesters from 8am-6pm, and three days a week during the Summer semester, 8am-6pm. Clinic sites can be up to 1 hour and 30 minutes from the Beeville Campus. When assigning a student to clinic sites, the program will consider student living arrangements but will remain equitable to ensure all students receive a diverse clinical experience. If a student resides more than a one-and-a-half-hour drive from the Beeville campus, the student should be prepared to relocate to the Beeville area for duration of the program.

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS**

- Applicants must be over 18 by the time they will apply for licensing through the Texas Medical Board.
- Applicants must be mentally and physically able to perform radiologic procedures.
- The Radiology Program is only offered on the Beeville Campus.
- The Radiology Program is exempt of the EDUC 1300 requirement.
- Twenty-one students will be selected into the program to begin each Fall. Student selection is based on a point scoring system. If there is tie, student academic history will be taken into consideration and a final decision will be made by program administration.
- Applications may be submitted throughout the academic year via email, mail, or in person. If sent by email, an email verification will be returned upon receipt.
- All official transcripts must be turned in to the program with your application, including those on file with CBC. The program will turn official transcripts into the Admissions office after application review.
- If you are turning in your application via email, list in the email the institutions the program should expect to receive transcripts from.
- Applications may be turned in prior to the transcripts if you are waiting on grades to be posted. Notify the Radiology Department when you expect the updated transcripts will be sent.
- If grades are not posted to your transcripts before the application deadline, you must notify the Radiology Department that you are waiting on your grades to be posted prior to the application deadline.
- Pre-requisites: BIOL 2301, 2101, 2302, 2102, and MATH 1314 must be completed within 7 years of program application deadline.
- GPAs will be averaged for applicants with multiple transcripts when determining GPA points toward application.
- Applications will be reviewed early June; acceptance, denial, and alternate letters will be sent via email and First-Class, mid-June.

The program encourages any applicants that have been involved in any of the following and are concerned they may not be eligible for licensing to request an [Ethics Review Preapplication](#). Completion of this process before beginning the program will ensure the student will be eligible for licensing through the ARRT.

- Felony or misdemeanor charges or convictions (including speeding tickets and parking violations that are considered misdemeanors or felonies)
- Charges or convictions concerning traffic violations that involved drugs or alcohol
- Convictions in a military court-martial
- Violations of state or federal narcotics or controlled substance laws, even if you aren't charged or convicted
- Disciplinary actions concerning a professional license, permit, registration, or certification
- Violations of an honor code at an educational institution you attended to meet ARRT certification and registration requirements
